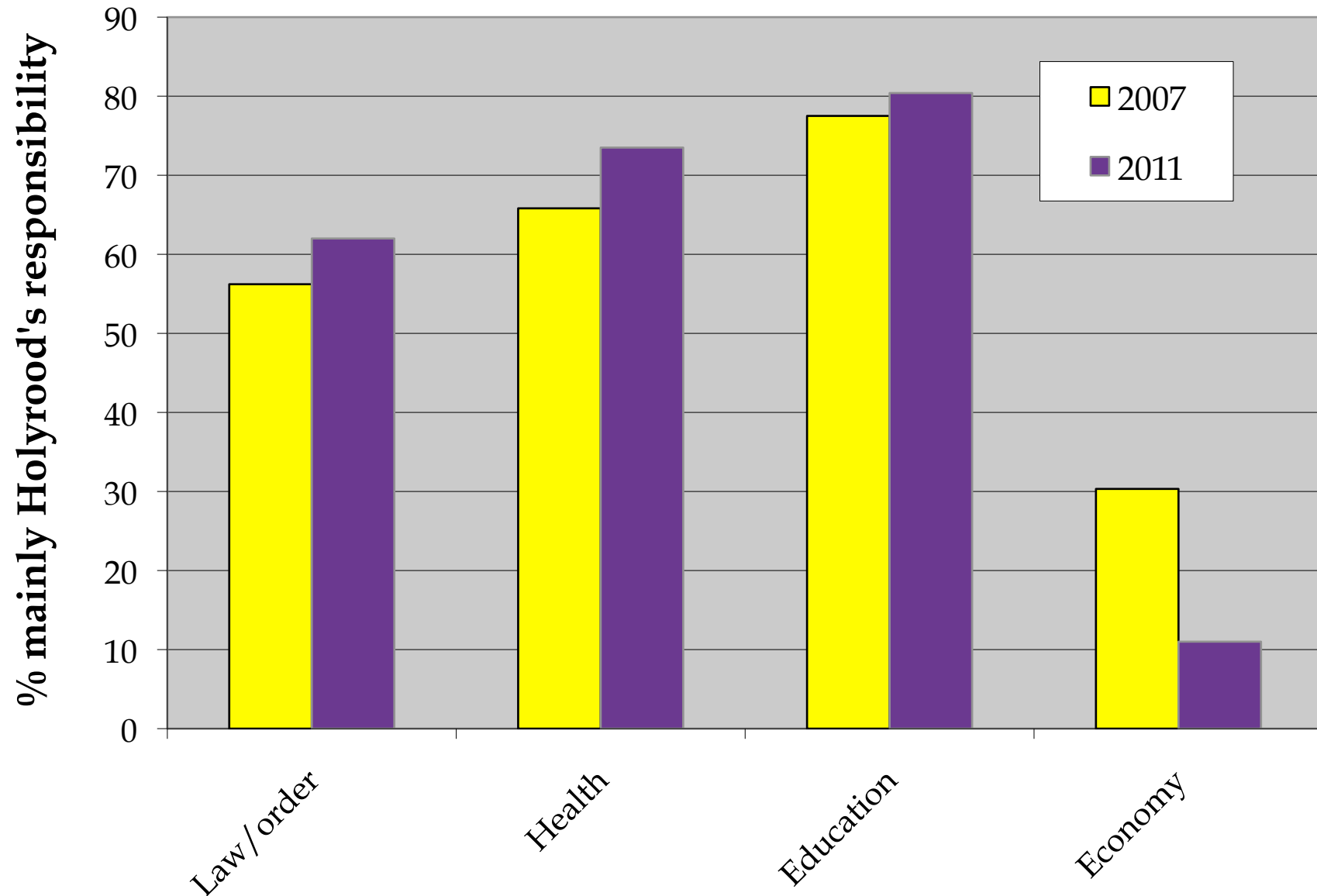

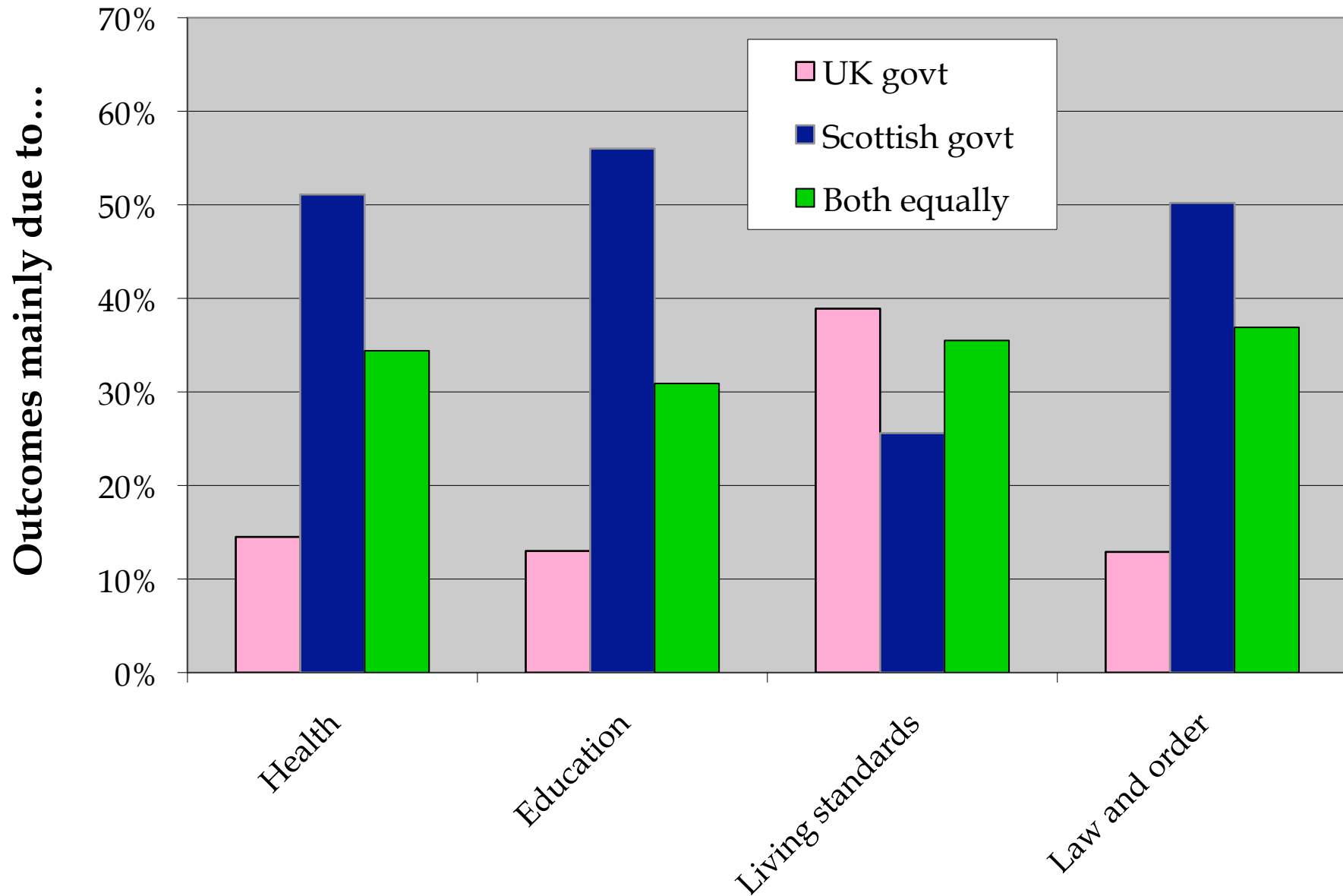
Four key aspects of context:

Q: “Do you usually think of yourself as being a supporter of one particular party?”

- 44% said ‘No’
- Many saying ‘Yes’ then abstained or defected

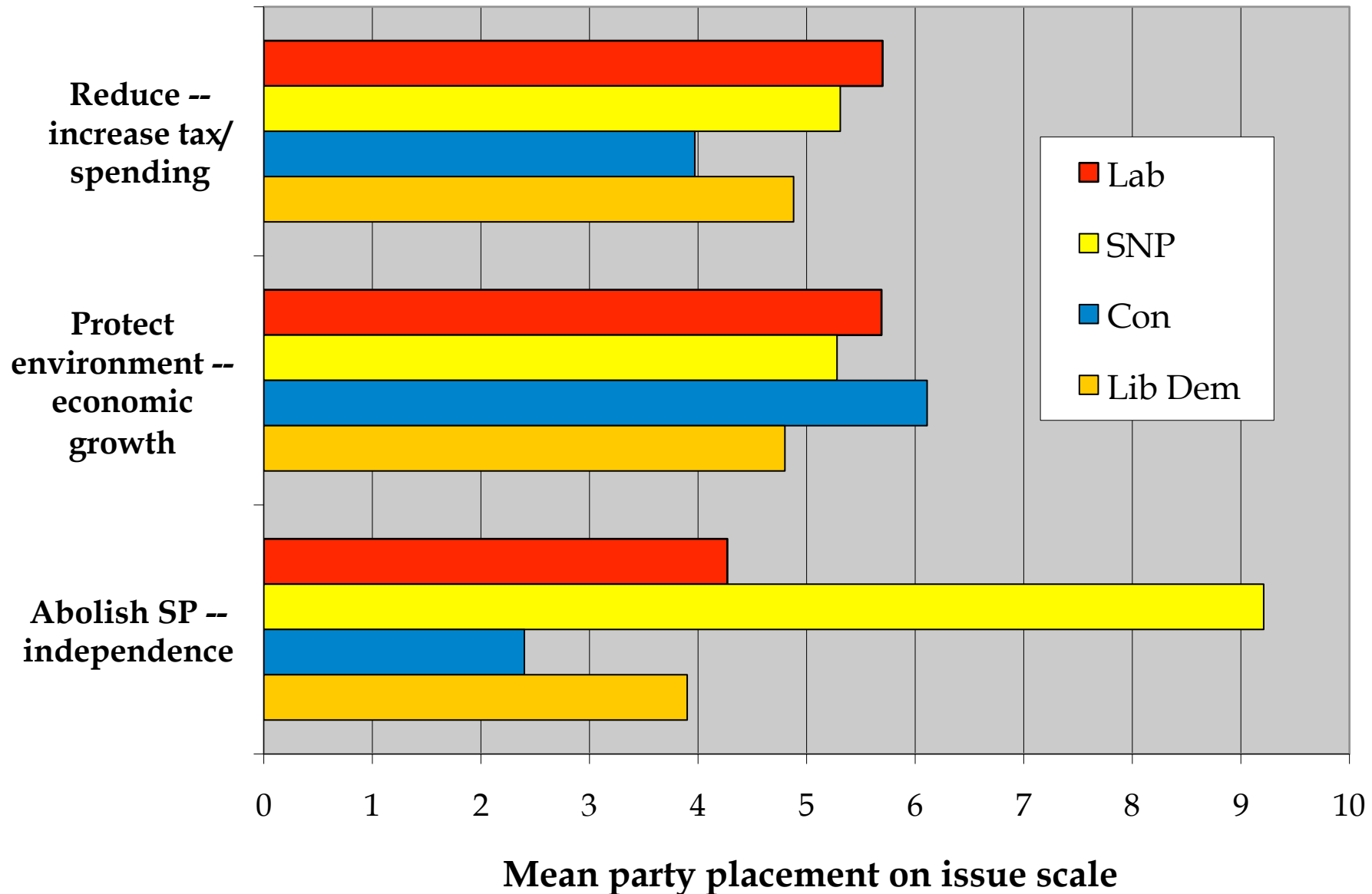

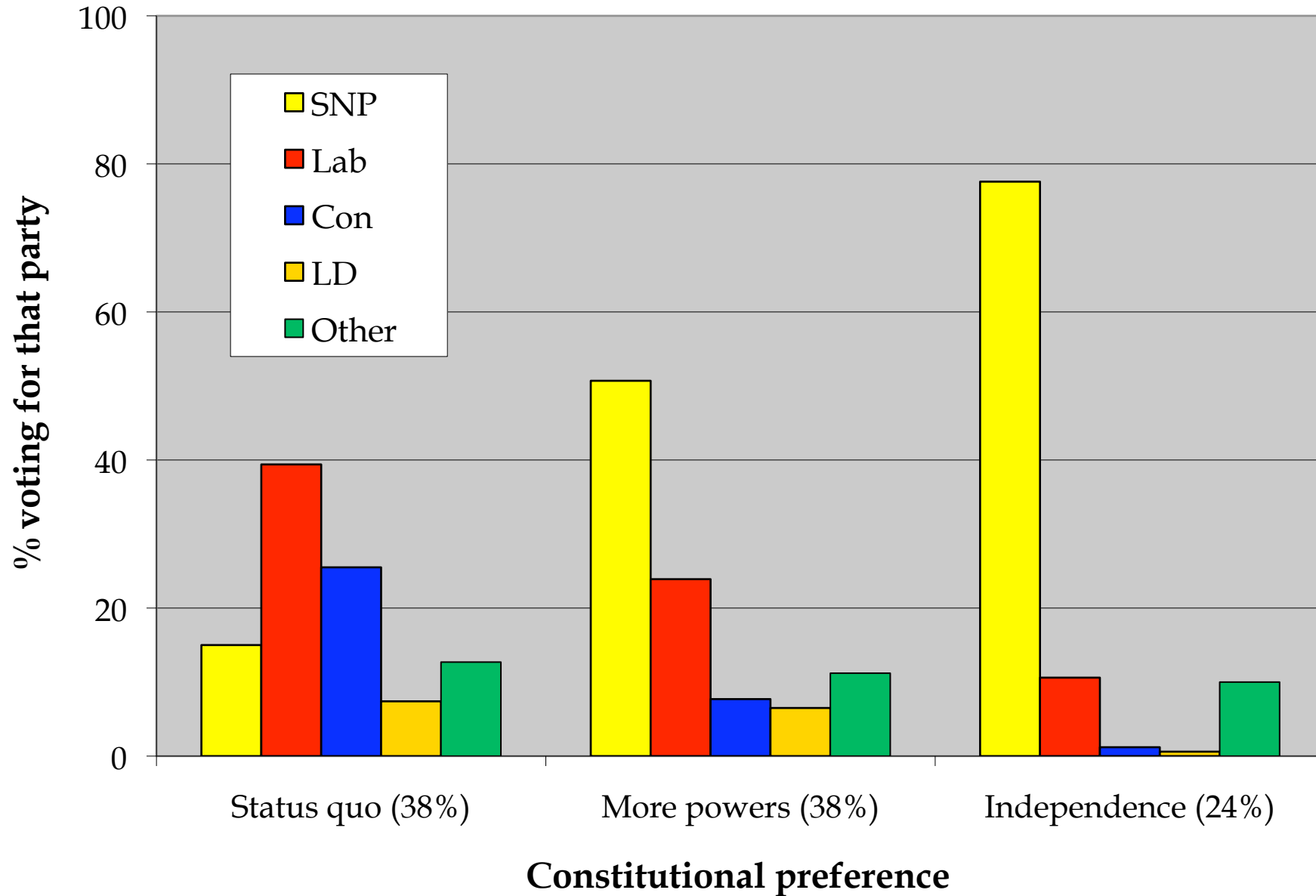

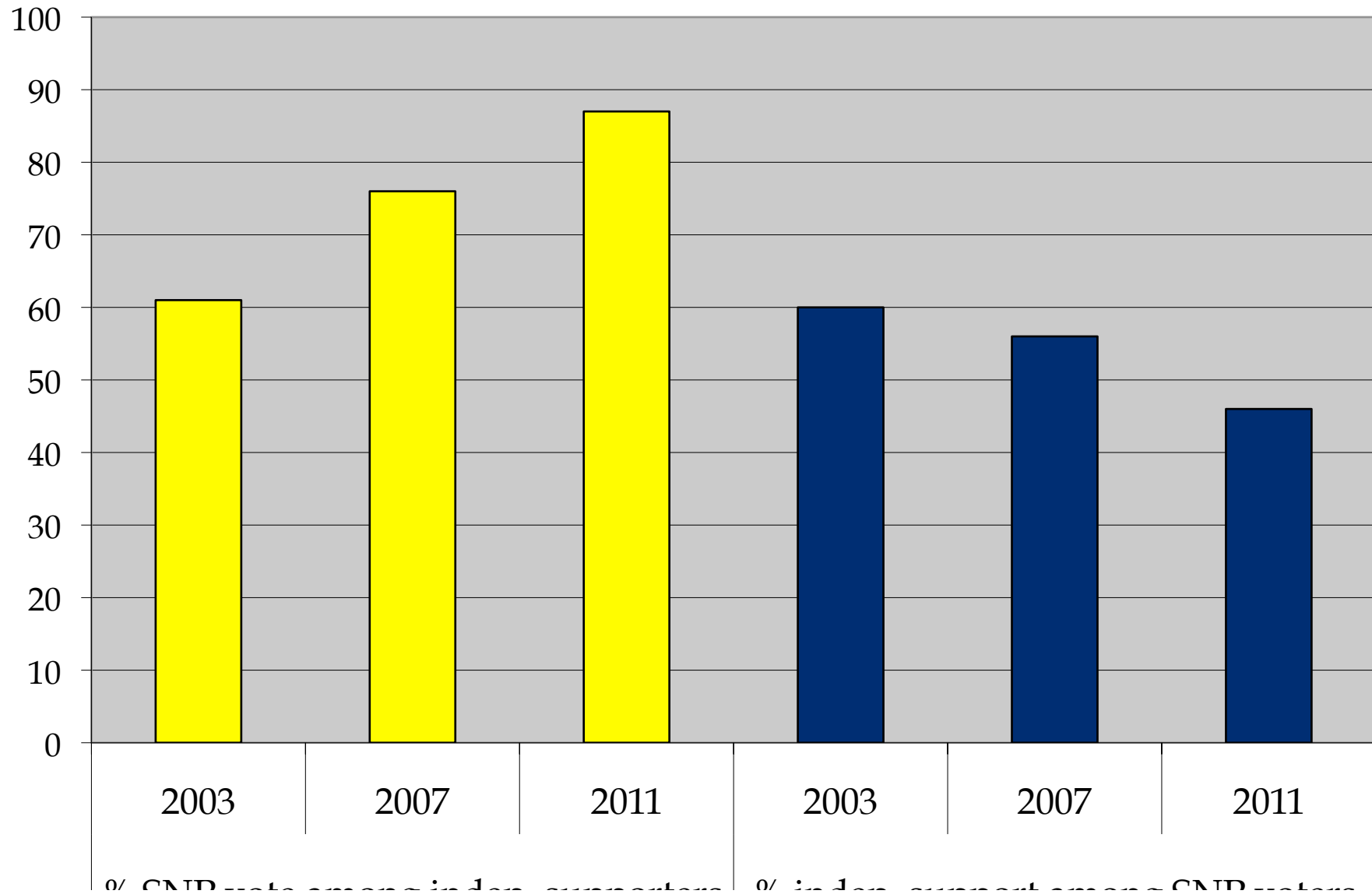
Q: “How do you think the return of an SNP minority government would affect the likelihood of independence?”

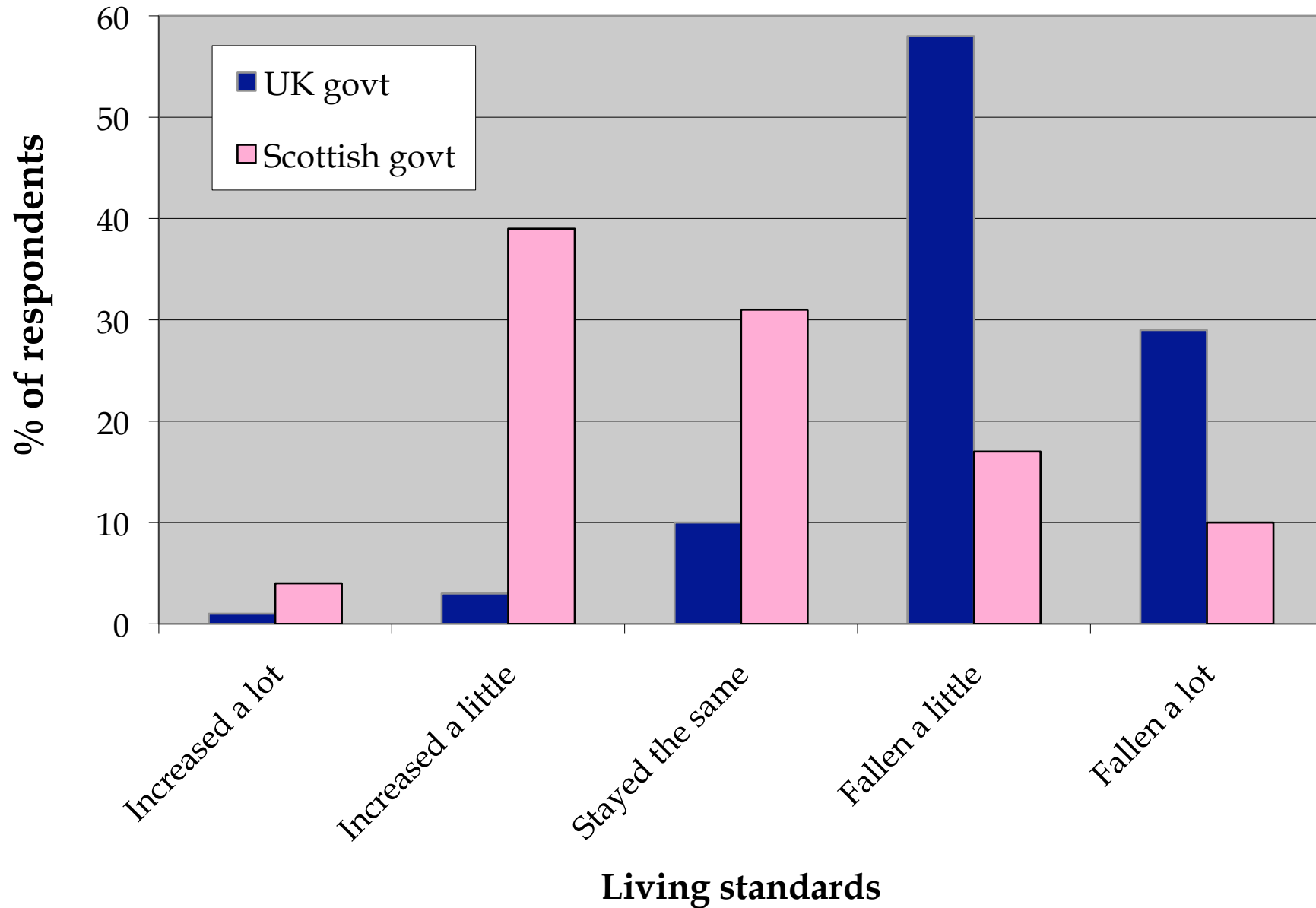

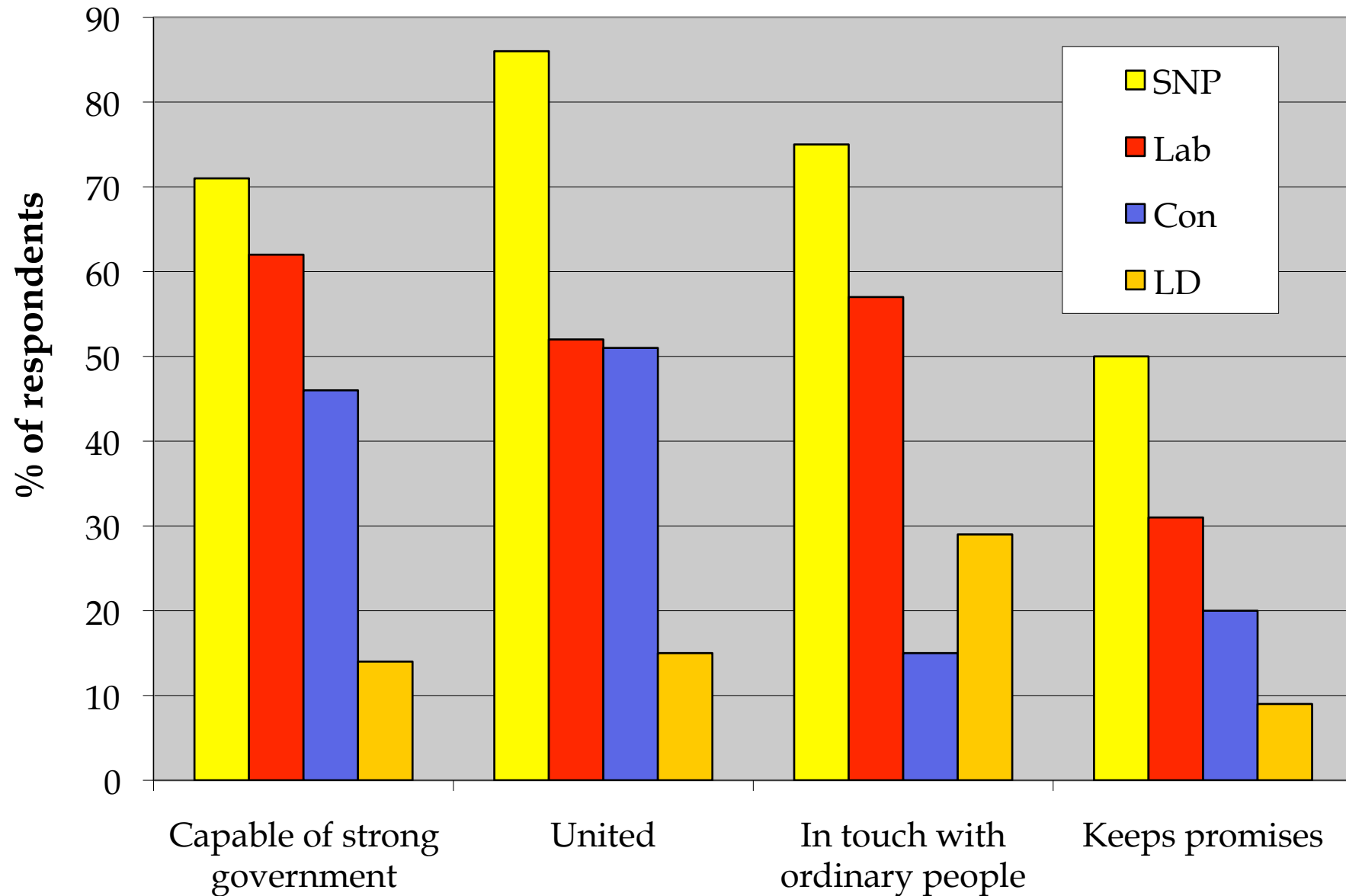

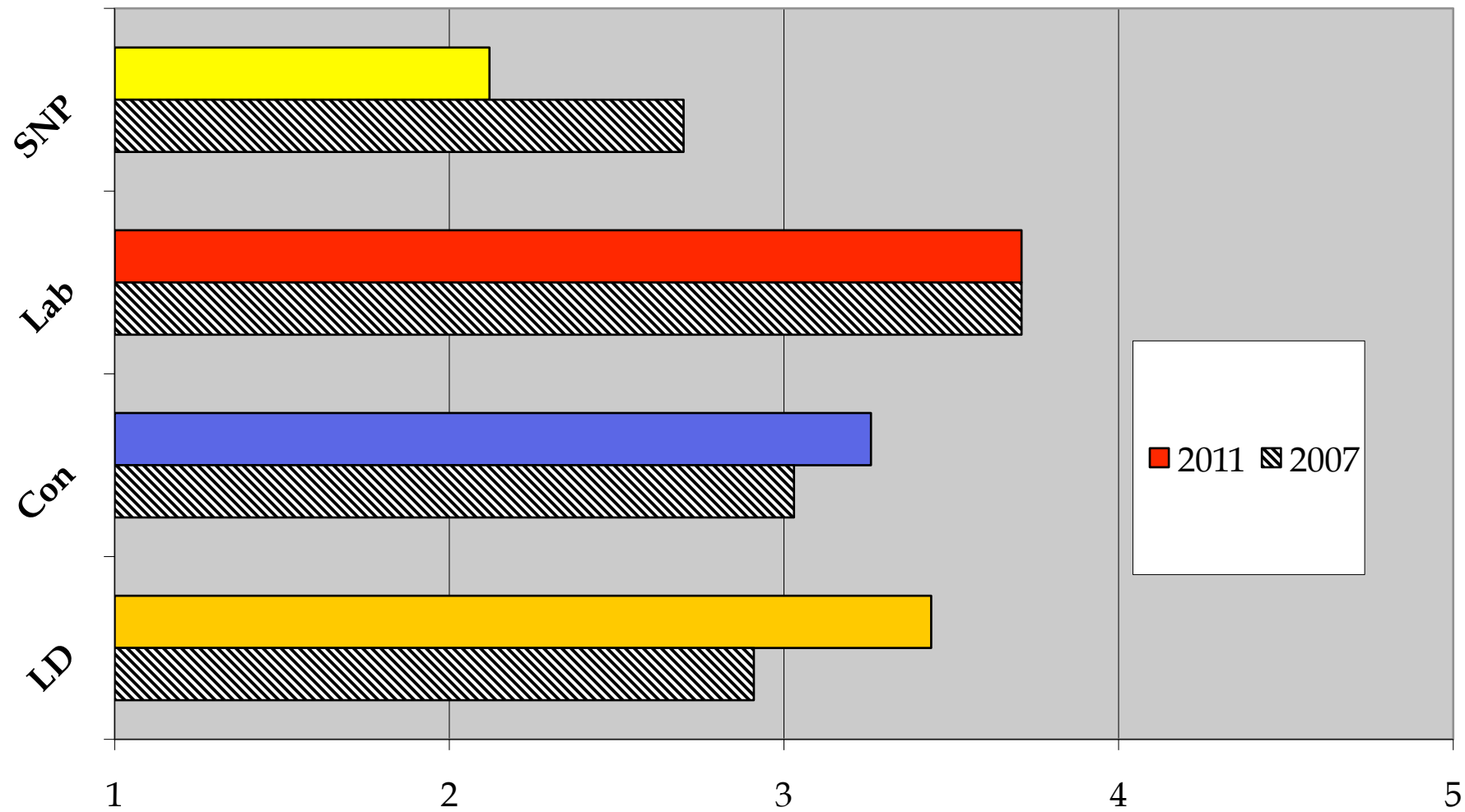

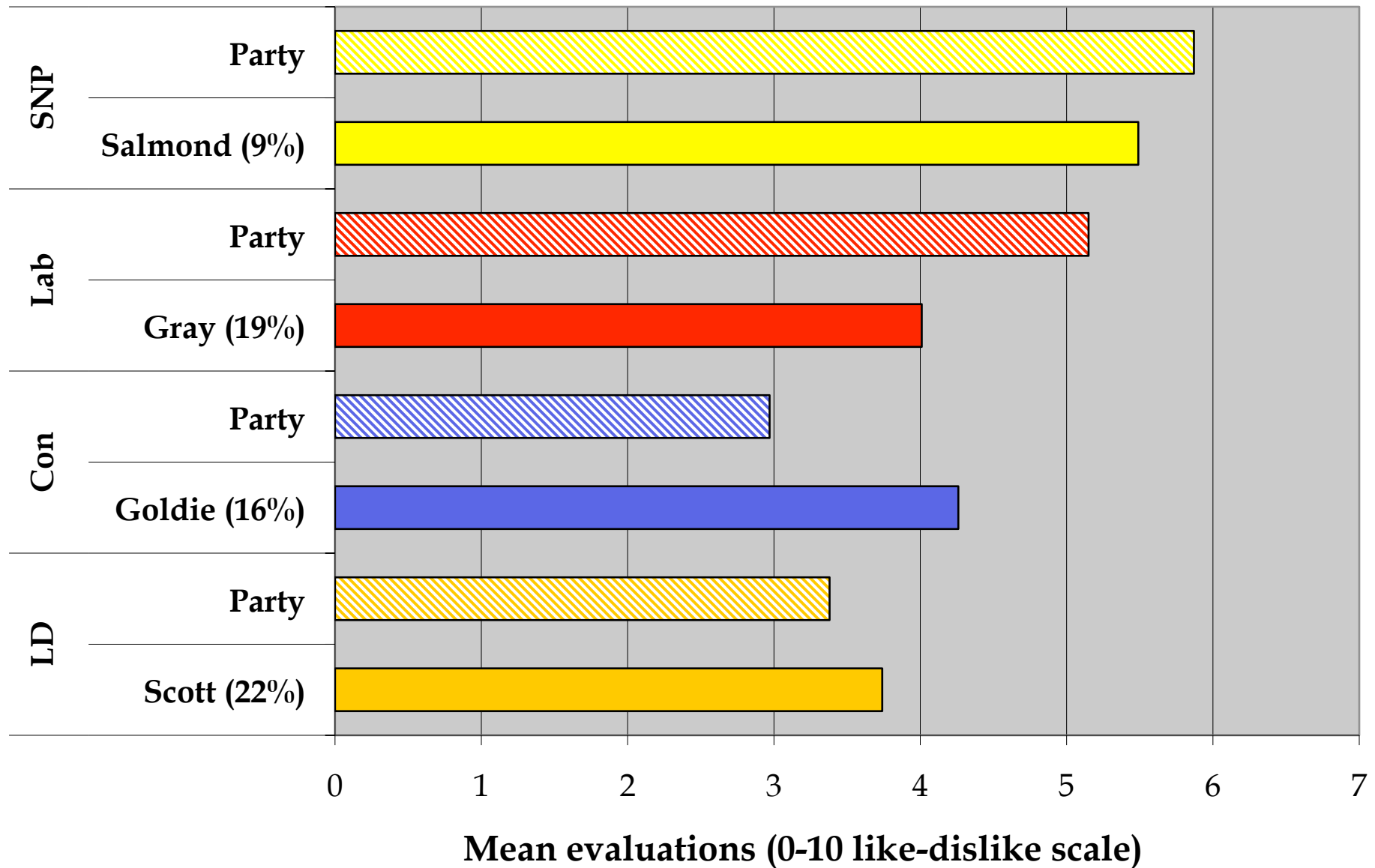

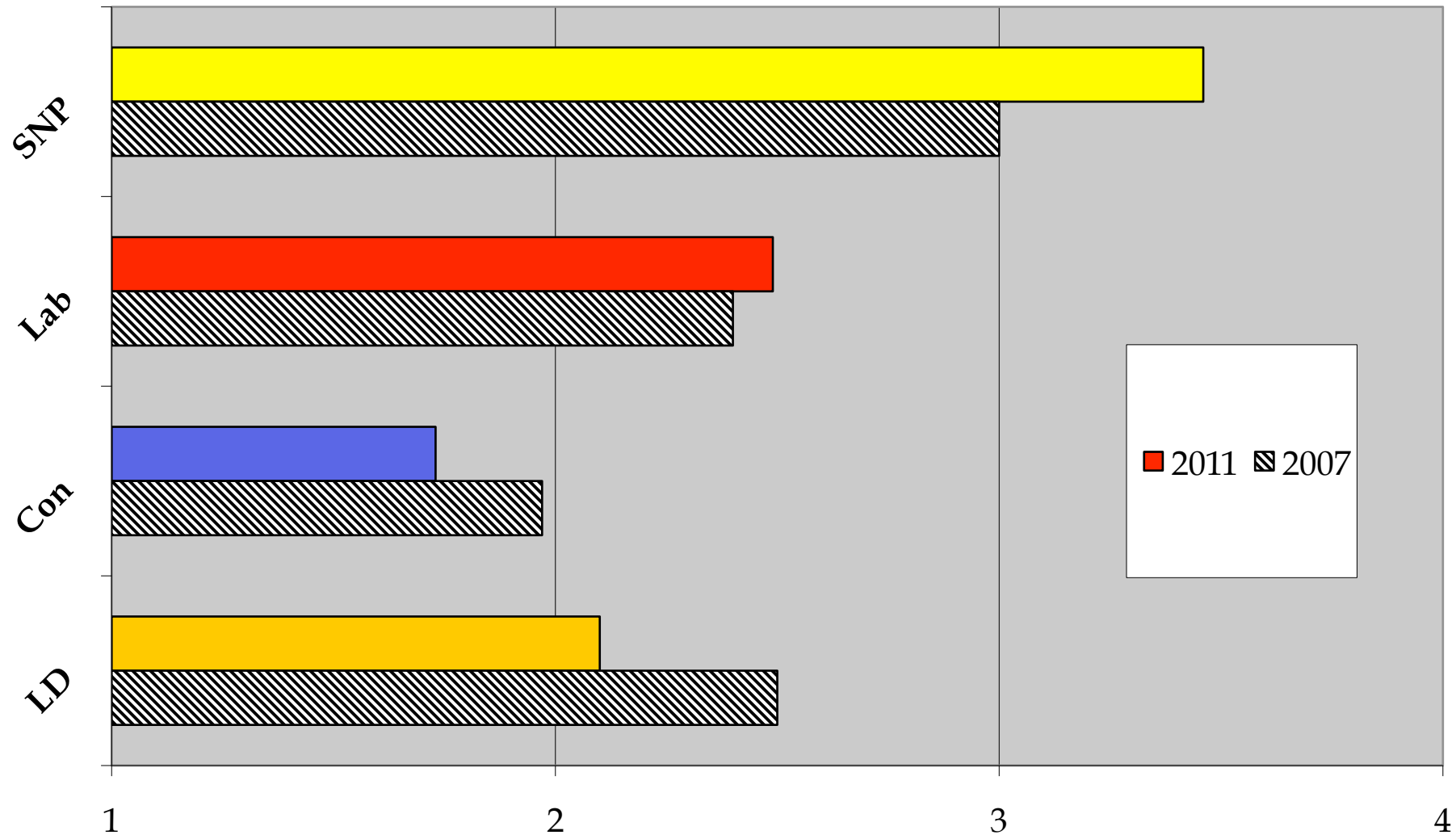
Mean ratings of campaigns (1 = v. positive, 5 = v. negative)

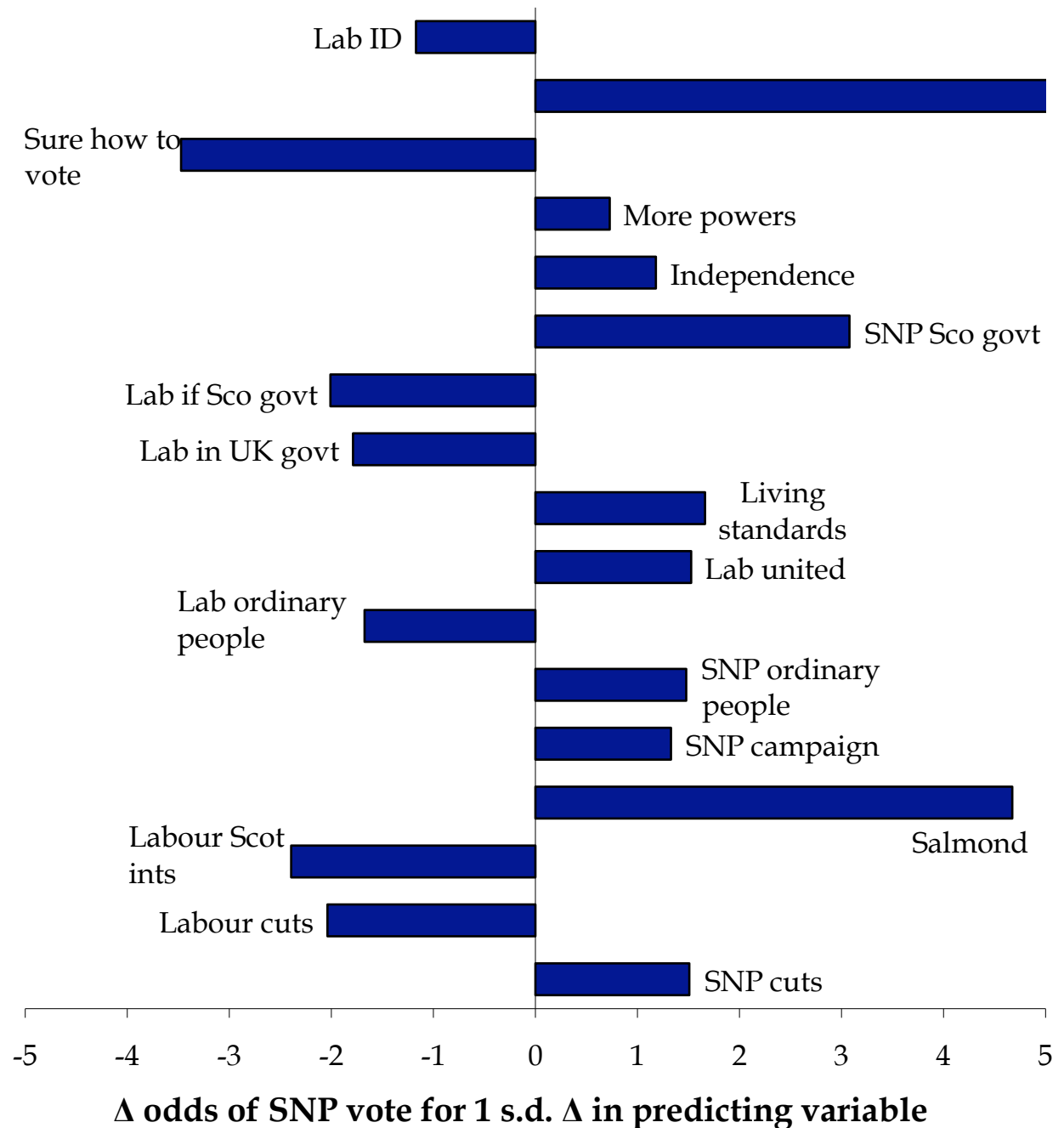
